The purpose of Avanti is to contribute to society through the systematic pursuit of human values and spiritual development.

The idea for Avanti began in 2003 and our first school was opened in 2008. Our vision was for a family of schools based upon our core principles of educational excellence, character formation and spiritual insight. We now have close to 4000 students and 450 members of staff across our family of 10 schools.

Avanti now has a proven approach to school development and improvement, with excellent pupil outcomes across our schools and capacity to support more schools. We have built first-rate centralised functions for finance, HR, project management, marketing and premises. Our whollyowned trading subsidiary provides catering for our schools and to others.

We believe that 'The Avanti Fields Way' wheel underpins our academic, character and spiritual curriculum to clearly guide and empower our students to flourish in all aspects of school life and beyond.



The Three Pillars

Our school prepares pupils for their respective life-journeys by promoting educational excellence, character formation and spiritual insight.





An emphasis on independent thought and personal choice fans every pupil's innate and emerging passion for learning. Our personalised approach provides tailor-made learning paths for all pupils. This motivates and enables all pupils to become reflective, articulate and independent thinkers, laying solid foundations for their future learning, vocation and self-fulfilment. Our approach is characterised by a mentorship and academic support system that is delivered in close partnership with parents.

Character Formation



Our school prepares pupils to take their place as loyal, responsible and broad-minded British citizens. Our ethos acknowledges that personal virtue, responsibility and a wholesome sense of identity underpin success in all endeavours. It nurtures conduct consistent with the universal virtues of respect, integrity, humility, courage, empathy, gratitude and self-discipline. Avanti House promotes holistic, responsible lifestyles through a vegetarian diet, a curriculum that integrates yoga and meditation and a built environment that actively fosters environmental concern.

Spiritual Insight



The development of spiritual insight is at the heart of the curriculum and draws on the teachings of Krishna Chaitanya*, which embrace a universal, inclusive approach to spirituality, aimed at rekindling a personal, loving and spontaneous relationship with the divine (Krishna). The curriculum offers opportunities to explore the philosophies and traditions of different faiths. Collective worship includes the following practices: kirtan, meditation, worship, reflection, song, prayer, and story-telling.

^{*} Our ethos draws from the teachings of Chaitanya Mahaprabhu. Chaitanya was born in 1486 in Nadia, then East India's epicentre for learning and scholarship. At an early age he founded what quickly became the region's foremost school, widely renowned for its teaching in logic, grammar and rhetoric. He went on to lead an early civil disobedience movement, contesting religious sectarianism. In later life, he turned his attention to spiritual ideals that transcended social and religious boundaries and thus paved the way for a great spiritual renaissance. He taught that the essence of education is to appreciate how everything has a special relationship with the divine and that such an understanding culminates in a profound spiritual realisation of love, compassion and selflessness – the original, pure nature of every being. He emphasised spiritual equality and advocated that humanity can be united through a shared love of God, expressed through the singing of God's many names. Chaitanya's exemplary life heralded the dawn of an inclusive spiritual resurgence that continues to inspire people from all faiths.

Our New Site

Construction of our brand new state-of-the-art school is underwary at the Manor Farm site, on the Hamilton, Humberstone border.

The school will be a place of learning for students from nursery all the way through to GCSE. As an all-through School, Avanti Fields has been designed to create a cohesive sense of one school whilst providing appropriate and bespoke facilities for each phase.

The new school building will provide specialist teaching spaces, outdoor learning facilities such as forest school, sports pitches and a sports hall that will enhance the curriculum and learning for all students.



A Day in the Life of Avanti Fields

8.00 AM

Students begin to arrive. They may have walked or come by bike or come by bus. They gather with friends, talk with teachers, perhaps handing in slips for trips or instrumental lessons and prepare themselves for the day ahead.

8.30 AM

Tutor time begins; students go to their tutor group bases to meet with their tutor who sees them every day. Every day begins with worship and mindfulness. In classes students lead the worship and twice a week we all gather to share in collective worship, think about the week ahead and explore the key values that lead us.

8.50 AM

Lessons begin promptly. Learning is at the heart of all activities; teachers encourage students to be curious and explore new ideas and concepts. Avanti Fields students are confident and work well together to solve problems and share ideas. Focussed individual work and collaborative activities are varied throughout lessons to provide the best route to learning

10.40 AM

At Break students can play and exercise outside, catch up with friends or sit quietly and chat or read.

10.55 AM

Lessons continue; our highly qualified teachers know the students well and plan lessons that stretch, challenge and support in equal measure. Lessons are planned to help students recall and retain new learning; regular low stake tests, homework tasks and memory techniques are used to help students build up their subject specific skills and knowledge.

12.45 PM

Lunch is held in the dining hall. Students enjoy a choice of hot meals, cold wraps, rolls and salads. The lunch meals cooked on-site are vegetarian (in line with the faith ethos of the school). They sit together, taking time to eat and talk. School staff often enjoy taking lunch with pupils, creating a family atmosphere. After lunch students can again spend time outdoors; a game of football or table tennis is always underway in designated areas and our lunch clubs support a range of sports and exercise.

1.40 PM

The afternoon begins. Our innovative curriculum offers the full range of academic subjects, but also offers something extra; students can also explore philosophy, practice Yoga and learn Sanskrit.

The final lesson ends with the end of day reflection, on what we have learned and focusing our mind for the journey home.

3.30 PM

The school days ends, some students return home, others may stay to enjoy the after school clubs on offer – including a range of sports, debating, homework support, Art Club and Science Club.

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The Curriculum

The Avanti Fields curriculum has been designed to meet students' individual learning needs, so every student has the maximum opportunity to succeed and realise their ambitions. Our curriculum is planned in order to prepare students for success at GCSE, over the five years starting from Year 7. Students will learn the key skills for success during Key Stage 3 and will begin GCSEs in Year 10.

Key Stage 3: Years 7 to 9

At Key Stage 3 we deliver a rich, broad and balanced curriculum, which has an academic foundation but is adapted to meet the needs of individual learners. As a faith school, our Trust-led, bespoke philosophy, religion & ethics curriculum, alongside the practice of yoga and wellbeing form a unique backdrop for the development of character and spiritual insight in our learners. There is a six hour teaching day which comprises of six 55 minute sessions with optional after-school clubs which are integral to the school's ethos.

Key Stage 4: Years 10 & 11

During Key Stage 4, the curriculum will build on the subjects and content of Years 7 - 9 and is served by the same core principles – each child will be:

- treated as a unique individual with access to a broad, balanced and appropriate curriculum
- enjoys positive relationships between students and staff
- experiences an enabling environment that stimulates learning
- discovers innovative approaches to learning and personal development both as a team leader and a team player

The core curriculum will be based on the English Baccalaureate and include English, mathematics, science, modern foreign languages, (Spanish and French), humanities (history and geography) and PRE. As well as ensuring that all young people reach a level of numeracy that enables them to access and engage with the numerical requirements of society, mathematical approaches to the world and to learning will be essential elements of the distinctiveness of the school. The mathematics specialism at Avanti Fields will give your child:

- the skills and knowledge to manipulate and use numbers with growing confidence and skill in a wide range of contexts
- a growing understanding of and engagement with the economic world we live in and their roles and responsibilities within it
- skills in shaping and posing questions and developing convincing arguments that can be presented in a variety of ways
- a growing understanding that, beyond the functional, mathematics has rich spiritual, historical and cultural roots.

- Subject Leaders



- Lessons designed to be relevant to students' lives, to develop learning and questioning skills, and to deepen motivation, understanding and personal insight.
- Partnerships with universities, links with businesses, and opportunities for apprenticeships and work-related learning.
- Sincere and committed engagement of parents (and other family members) as co-educators.






How we achieve our vision

- Dedication to leadership at every level and nurture of students' voice and involvement, up to Governance level.






How we achieve our vision

- Dedication to working in partnership with other faith schools/organisations to provide students an authentic experience of diverse spiritual traditions.
- Recognition that all of the world's great spiritual traditions represent the divinity in their distinctive ways.
- Authentic understanding of the worldviews underpinning various manifestations of religion and spirituality, with stress on their shared essence: a loving reciprocal and personal relationship with the divine.

- Exploration of faith and spirituality across different traditions in a probing and dialogic manner, with constructive critique of practices, philosophies and epistemologies to promote honest and empathetic dialogue.
- Encouragement of students to develop a broad-minded perspective by acknowledging the key roles of free choice, fidelity to tradition and exemplary role models.
