In year 3 this week, we have been learning the story of The Papaya that spoke. We have been acting out the story based on our story map (see picture below).

This week Foxglove / Year 4 class have been:

In English we have been learning to recall a story (the narrative) using a combination of words and sign language. This is a new whole school initiative called "Talk for Writing".

The children have really enjoyed retelling the story of "The Mango that Spoke" to one another and the class. Please ask your child to perform the story to you.

In topic we have been exploring the continents of the world. We have discussed the countries we have visited and where our relatives live.

In maths, we have been revising place value and how the value of a number changes when it moves column. Next week: We will be exploring number lines.

Snapdragon:

It's been lovely to have all the children back in school, there are a few tired faces by the end of the day, me included! Everyone should have brought a reading book home by now, please if you can mark in their reading diary that your child/ren have ready, it would be fantastic. Our maths this week has been based around place value and rounding numbers, we are developing that on next week into learning about negative numbers and solving word problems involving rounding.

We have started a new way of teaching English which involves retelling a story using movement and actions and then mimicking the style of the story. The aim is to enhance descriptive language and I have seen some fantastic imaginative work so far.

Our science topic is about materials and their properties, we have 2 lessons a week, I'm aiming for one being a practical lesson and the other a write up of what we did. Next week we are looking at how to separate materials. Within topic we are looking at climate change, it's a topic which seems to have got a lot of reaction from the children which is fantastic. I'll be sending home a single use plastic diary to keep for a week on Friday and we will be doing a letter or email to Boyan Slat (he has invented a way in which to remove plastic from the ocean.) The children have already come up with a fantastic range of questions for him.

I've been really pleased with the start to the year and it's been lovely to speak to some of you this week, if you have any problems or questions please get in touch.
