# Class Updates

---

## RECEPTION

It is so fantastic to see the children are settling in well after their first full week in school. This week we have been playing speaking and listening games in our phonics time, listening to different instruments, recognising rhyme in stories and practising our alliteration using our names. In Maths we have been exploring 'Matching' with the resources around the classroom, asking the question Do they match? and Why? The class even helped sort my laundry basket helping me to match up my socks in pairs!

For our topic we have been exploring big questions 'What makes a good friend?' and 'How can we help a friend?' We added these questions to our Friendship tree.

## DAFFODIL

Hello parents and carers, year one have been exploring a lot over the past week.

In maths we have stayed looking at addition to consolidate knowledge of number bonds and comparing number bonds (greater than, less than). We will look at subtraction next week.

The children have been working on team work on the afternoons with construction and learning through play.

In science we have been looking at the body parts.

Next week in English we will be looking at instructions.

## SUNFLOWER

Hello Sunflower Class parents

We have had an amazing week in Year 2. Children have worked exceptionally hard and have shown great focus and resilience.

In literacy, we have been rewriting the story of The Three Little Pigs. You know your children tell the story well, as they have been sharing this with you at home. However, this week they have made changes to the traditional story, to create their own versions. We've had 'The Three Little Platypus', 'The Big Bad Tiger' and 'The Three Little Cows and The Little Bad Mouse', to name a few. Children have started to write their story!

In maths, we have been solving all sorts of subtraction problems using a number line. Your children are now expert detectives at unpicking the clues to work out exactly what they need to do to solve number sentences, missing number equations, missing symbol equations and word problems! Ask your child to explain to you what  $20 - 8 = 12$  means.

We have also enjoyed fun science lessons, drawing around our partners and labelling body parts including bones, joints and organs and finding out what they do.

In art, we worked in the art studio to create self-portraits in the style of Andy Warhol using pastels and vibrant coloured pencils.

Some real WOW work taking place in Sunflower Class. Well done Year 2!

## IRIS

This week in year 3, we have started a new writing unit in English. We are learning to write an informative letter. This week we have been focusing on writing one to a friend, with a string focus on the important features that make up a letter.

In maths, we are continuing to develop our addition and subtraction skills. We have introduced key vocabulary such as exchange. We have been using a range of resources to fully understand crossing 10s and 100s.

On Wednesday, the children became scientists and carried out an investigation into what happens when we move a light source closer and further away from an opaque object. We predicted, observed and evaluated.

Topic – Keeping within the realm of the natural world, we have started to learn about the UK's natural resources. Our first task was to explore the difference between natural resources and renewable resources.

Art – This week we explored the abstract works of artist Paul Klee. In addition, we created our own abstract journey pictures.

Yoga – We are loving our yoga with Miss Penning. It is a peaceful lesson in our busy day!

Dear parents/guardians

This week we have been developing our knowledge of the environment and how humans have been causing change, our focus has been based around plastic and pollution. We are putting together a presentation on how we can improve our 'eco friendliness' in school.

In Maths our focus has been subtraction, we will be continuing this next week and developing into subtraction of decimals which is an area which has been tricky for a lot of the class.

Within science we have checked whether our experiments from last week have worked and discussed ways of improving them and why they have/haven't worked. The children have shown some good scientific understanding.

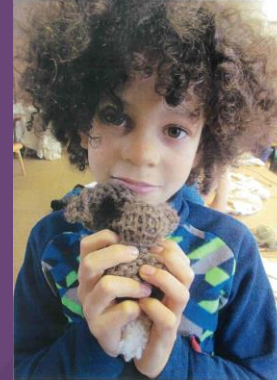

EYFS: In EYFS, children partnered up to identify colours and blend their partners colours to create a shared piece of art.

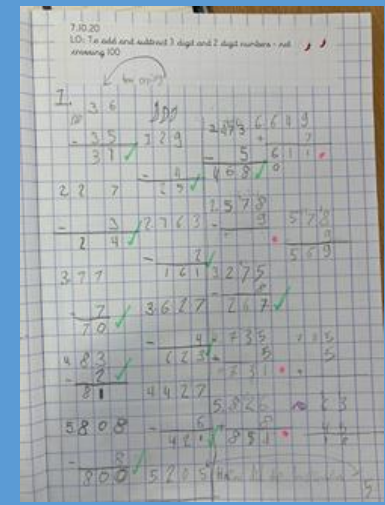
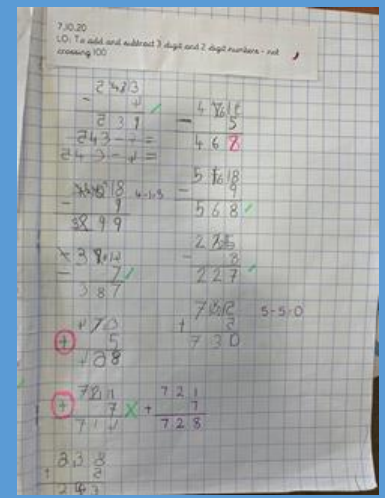


Year 1: Agate impressed Mrs Cook with a brilliant invention based on the three little pigs. Agate has invented her characters (cats) within a new setting.

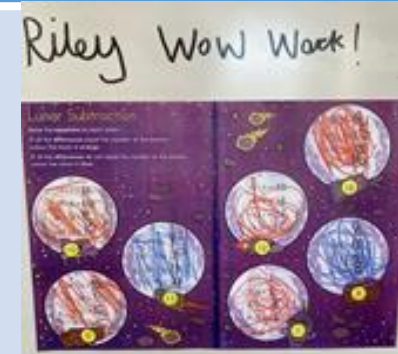


Year 2: Angelee deserved this week's award for her amazing writing, where spelling, punctuation and story telling have been used fabulously. Well done!

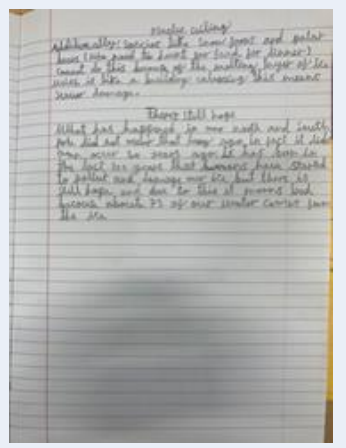
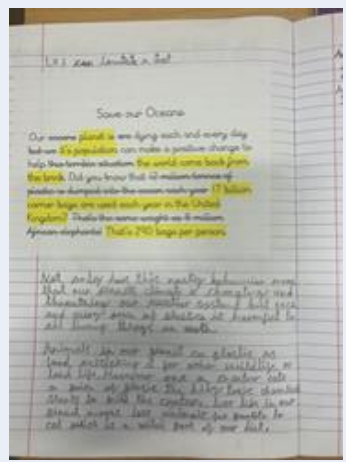
Year 3: Iris were pleased with Olivia's great subtraction in mathematics. Olivia has shown great determination to persevere in her learning. Well done Olivia!
