RECEPTION

SUNFLOWER

Hello Sunflower Class parents

Year 2 have had a made a fantastic start to Term 2.

We have begun our new topic on The Great Fire of London. The children have been so engaged and curious. They are enjoying reading non-fiction texts for information and this week we have made a timeline to show the order of the key events. Miss Jeffries and I have been flabbergasted by the amount of information children have absorbed and retained on the subject. Please do ask them to share their learning with you.

In maths we have begun learning the concept of multiplication. In Year 2 children start this by making equal groups. This week we have explored how to make 2, 3 and 4 equal groups of varying amounts and how to explain what we have, mathematically, by saying "I have equal groups of ."

Children have also been identifying when groups are unequal and explaining their reasoning.

In English we have begun learning a new text using a story map and actions. The story is called Little Charlie and the children can now tell the opening and the build-up independently. We are also writing the story as we learn it!

Sunflower Class have made great progress in their reading over the last term and as such, some changes will be made to phonics groups from next week. If you would like to know more about your own child's current stage on their reading journey, and how to support them at home, please do drop me an email.

This week families should have received the new hot lunch menu. May I ask that you discuss the day's lunch choices with your child before coming to school (or the evening before) so that they can bring a packed lunch, should they prefer.

IRIS and PEONY

We have thoroughly enjoyed welcoming Year 3 back this term. They have come back to school very refreshed and keen to learn. In English, we have started to look at how to create suspense in our writing. The children have identified some excellent ideas and have shown great creativity and imagination. As a class we are learning the story of Kassim and the greedy dragon.

In maths, this is our last week on addition and subtraction. All the children have shown incredible resilience and it was wonderful to see how much they remembered from last term. Thank you to the parents for supporting them with their home learning, it is having a huge and positive impact. This term, in topic we are learning about WW1. We will be looking at the war through the life of Walter Tull. So far this week, the children in year 3 have identified some key facts about his life and his childhood. We even did some role play where a child became Walter Tull in the hot seat in order to answer questions asked by their peers.

In science we began to look at why living things need food and reminded ourselves of the types of foods that humans need to be healthy. The children created their own menu's and thought about how they could provide for different diets.

Welcome back to school and to Term 2.

Foxglove Class have had an amazing week and the weather has added to this.

In Maths we have been working outside using trundle wheels and metre sticks to refine our measuring skills. The children were really excited to be able to get outside in the sunshine and use their Maths skills and knowledge in a practical and investigative way.

In English we have looked at diary writing. We have thought about the features of writing a diary including;

Writing in the first person, writing in the past tense, writing in a chronological order, writing about our feelings and emotions and retelling events from a day lived yesterday.

In Art, we have begun to focus on how Treasure Chests are made and decorated, as well as their purpose. This is a Design and Technology unit which is linked to our topic of Pirates, this term.

In Topic, the children have been learning about Bristol dock area and the notorious stories of piracy and theft that have emerged from days gone by. In Science, this week we have started a new topic called 'States of Matter'. The children were very interested and motivated to tell me all they knew about solids, liquids and gases; which made for a great start to the unit.

Some children mimicked the movement of particles found in these different states of being.

SPANISH




<u>CRAFT</u>


Year 1:




