In English, we have been writing instructions using time conjunctions and adverbs of manner. Next week, we will be inventing a set of instructions to write.


We have continued division in maths this week and started to look at the inverse and how we can use this to help check our answers.

We have had another busy, wonderful week in Foxglove class!





Reception (Thursday am) - Orchid and Lavender class - We worked on chest pushes and passing into space. Our star of the week was Axel and Albert.



Our Star of the Week in Daffodils this week is Izzy.



too!




Year 4:






