
Hello Daffodil Families,


What a wonderfully busy week we have had in Daffodil class.

#### Hello Sunflower families,


WOW what a jampacked jolly week we've had in Sunflower Class this week.

In Maths this week we have been interpreting and presenting information in pictograms and bar charts and next week we will be looking at tables.




The children enjoyed learning about the structure and functions of the human skeleton and discussing which bones help support, provide movement and protect.


We have had some yellow and orange bands for reading which is brilliant. Please can you ensure you are reading every day with your child and recording it in their reading record. We will be monitoring this daily.


Our star of the week this week is Laura! Laura has made great progress in her phonics using her knowledge to support her reading and writing! Well done Laura!



#### **MEAL ACCOUNTS**

We would ask all parents and carers to please check that your Arbor meal account is paid in full by the end of term on Thursday 16th December. We will transfer balances (hopefully all accounts will be in credit) from Arbor to our new system Parentpay, ready for the new year.

We will also be sending out your log-in details for Parentpay on Friday 17th December. Once you have received this, please take a few moments to set up your account.

From the beginning of Term 3 in January, you will need to book your child's meals at home in advance, but you will only be able to do this if your account is in credit. Children who are entitled to Universal Free Schools Meals in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 and children entitled to Free School meals in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be able to book without payment.

#### Free NHS app helps you care for your sick child

Are you caring for a poorly child and don't know who to turn to for advice? The HANDi App, developed for the NHS by a team of paediatric experts, provides support to parents/carers and medical professionals looking after children with the most common childhood illnesses. These include diarrhoea and vomiting, high temperature, abdominal pain, chest problems such as wheezing and asthma, and common problems experienced by newborn babies.


As well as providing up-to-date NHS advice on common childhood conditions and how to treat them, the HANDi App has a quick and easyto-use child symptom checker. The app takes you through a series of questions about the symptoms your child is experiencing and then advises on the best course of action, whether that's to treat at home, to make a GP appointment, or to head to A&E. Each of the most common childhood illnesses has a




