Although we have only had four days in class this week, the children's learning has continued to flourish.

In Maths our Year 5 children have been looking at translating shapes across the vertices whilst in Year 6 we have been using ratio and scale factors to solve problems.

The children's writing has been brilliant to see this week. In Year 5 we have looked at the poem 'Please Mrs Butler' before writing our own versions. In Year 6, we have been looking at the book Wild Boy. We have discussed how the setting and the characters are very similar and the reasons why this might be.

We finished off our prototypes in DT on Monday in preparation to start our final designs next week. The children have spent a lot of time experimenting with a range of pulleys and levers that make up their pop-up books.


