

We created a mind map of different animals that we could turn the goats into and also started to think about what the troll could become. The children have now all made their own innovated story – do ask them to tell you their story!

We have been poets in English this week, where we have written a riddle poem using expanded noun phrases and similes. Next week, we will be looking at Haiku poems.


We really enjoyed the 'Speak out, stay safe' assembly and know how to keep ourselves safe and the ChildLine number should we need it.

Dear Snapdragon Families,

It has been a brilliant week in Snapdragon class – the children have worked extremely hard.

The highlight of our week was testing out how strong columns are in History. We looked at the Parthenon and how it was built before attempting to create their own columns.

In English, Year 6 have been looking at describing a character. We studied Augustus Finch from Wild Boy and then looked at how the setting could be matched to the characters description. In Year 5, we have been looking at creating a balanced argument. To do this, we have practised using modal verbs and discussed whether it is better to be a child or an adult.

In Maths, Year 5 have been learning about translation and reflection whilst in Year 6 we have been adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators and solving some very tricky division problems using the bus stop method.


STAR OF THE WEEK

Lavender:


Our star of the week this week is Davina! Davina independently drew a picture of her favourite animal from Puxton Park, a cow! Well done Davina!



Year 1


Our star of the week is Herbie. He has concentrated on writing full sentences and kept his letters all the same size. A great week

Your Holiday Hub (YHH) programme this Easter

The Your Holiday Hub (YHH) programme returns this spring to offer families another school holiday programme of fun activities.

YHH is a free, school holiday programme for school-age children and young people who receive benefits-related free school meals (FSM). Sessions include a variety of fun activities, including sports, music, arts and crafts, and other great opportunities to learn and develop skills like making friends and trying new activities.

In Bristol, 49 organisations and providers have received funding to host over 400 four-hour inclusive sessions across the city, from the 11–22 April. This is double the number of free school holiday clubs that were available to children and young people over the Christmas holiday. Every activity includes a healthy and nutritious meal. Encouraging children and young people to learn more about healthy eating is also part of the programme.

Eligible children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) or an education, health and care plan are welcome at YHH, please contact the organisation or session you would like to attend to discuss your child's individual needs.

Children and young people who are observing Ramadan, which coincides with the Easter school holiday this year, can join in with less strenuous activities if desired, and can take home food to enjoy later.

We are going to be providing eligible families FSM vouchers for the Easter break and these will be distributed by education settings.

Families of children or young people who do not get benefits-related FSM can find holiday activities by area on our Family Information Service website.

Bristol City Council is working with local schools, voluntary and community organisations, including Feeding Bristol, Playful Bristol, the Children's Kitchen and Bristol's Association for Neighbourhood Daycare deliver the government's Holiday Activities and Food programme (Your Holiday Hub). The free places are funded by the Department for Education.



Bristol Rovers Community Trust, is providing specifically targeted individuals the opportunity to attend our Easter holiday football Fun Days **FREE** of charge. These FREE spaces are being funded by Bristol City Council. The aim is to provide high quality sports provision, FREE of charge, for targeted members of the local community. This includes young people who currently **receive free school meals** or would benefit from **additional support** over this period.

The link above directs you to where you can book your son or daughter, or appropriate young person, onto the different days available. The number of free spaces available on each day is limited, and places will be given on a first come first served basis. When completing the online sign up form please use the promotional code **FUNDAY422** to claim your free place.

You can use this promotional code to attend all four days for FREE, however the code can **only cover a value of £10 at a time**. If you wish to **sign up to more** than one day you will **need to complete the same form multiple times,** with the same information, for each date you wish to attend, using the same promotional code each time **e.g. for 4 free days the form will need to be completed 4 separate times**. Otherwise the code will simply discount £10 off the final payment.


