In Maths we've revisited the 4 operations using metal and pictorial methods and have been exploring measuring in ml outdoors.

In English we've been working extremely hard on our writing. We've published our own stories, written character descriptions about imaginary creatures, a letter to Greenpeace for help in identifying them and persuasive statements about pets – phew!

During afternoon lessons we've used our learning about the moon landings to create fact files about Neil Armstrong in Topic. In Music we listened to songs with a space theme and discussed the different moods they evoke - We created artwork as we listened and made links between the colours we chose and the shapes we made.

In DT our lunar rovers are coming along nicely, it has been a joy to witness the children's problem solving and lateral thinking. We may have some engineers and astronauts in the making!

We are so proud of the children's focus and enthusiasm this week!

We've had another brilliant week in Iris class!

For English, we have been recapping the use of imperative verbs and subordinating conjunctions and using these in a set of instructions.

In Maths, we have been looking at angles, we have learnt what an angle is and the three main types: acute, obtuse and a right angle – see if the children can remember the difference!

The children have amazed me with their scientific skills this week. We completed an investigation looking at whether a longer femur means you can jump further. We made predictions, carried out our investigation, recorded the results and made a conclusion.

Today, we have had an internet safety morning. We have talked about how to use the internet safely and made some lovely posters to remind others.
