Dear Orchid families,

This week has been a very exciting week for Orchid class. On Thursday, the children spent the morning in their new classroom with Miss Lollover. I was told that they were absolutely amazing!

In Maths, we have been looking at numbers that are 'less than' and using our number knowledge to answer questions and explain our answers. They children are becoming much more secure in being able to discuss their thinking process. In Literacy, we have looked at a different seaside poem each day and explored rhyming words. Some of the children have had a go at writing their own rhyming sentences.

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Dear Snapdragon Families,

It has been another brilliant week in Snapdragon. In Geography, we have looked at the importance of the Prime-Greenwich Meridian line whilst in Outdoor Learning we created our own self-portraits using natural resources.
