Message from the Principal

As I write, people are already casting their votes for local council and European Parliament elections and there has already been much speculation about the result. I am not sure whether OFSTED would approve, but the children in the Primary phase appear to have the notion that I am now the Prime Minister. While this is pleasing in one sense, maybe OFSTED would suggest we need to have some revised input in our Citizenship lessons!

It is always a delight to visit the Primary team and their classes and this morning was no exception with two excellent pieces of recent news to share – the really positive comments from Val McGregor, senior DfE adviser, on the progress made in the Primary phase during the year and the added bonus of once again very positive feedback from the Early Years Foundation Stage Moderation by appointees from the local authority. It is quite a challenge with younger pupils to ensure progress is being made while also guaranteeing a stimulating environment in which the pupils have fun, are happy and enjoy their learning. Sincere thanks to Mrs Radia, Mrs Edwards and our Primary colleagues who seem to have got the balance just right. This half-term, the Reception classes have been enjoying the new outside play area while Year One have been having a strong focus on the phonics tests which occur next month. We also have a series of fun activities lined up with visits from the Happy Puzzle Company, a local Dentist and Dental Hygienist and the Theatre Company "Perform". Not forgetting others, the school has also agreed to raise funds for the "Big Hug" Charity.

There were equally strong comments from Val McGregor about work in the secondary phase and I particularly liked her comment on the pupils i.e. "These children are used to being listened to." Indeed they are! We have used members of the student council to help us in our interviews for new staff; they are very astute judges and there was strong agreement on which colleagues should be appointed. If all goes to plan today, we will have recruited seven of the eight staff needed for September and I am delighted to say that they will complement and enhance an already strong team of staff. As with our Primary pupils, the students in Years 7 and 8 have much to look forward to before the summer – visits from Glaxo, Smith, Kline and the Eden project, an Australian author and of course the South Bank performance and our production of "Oliver". With further good news on the permanent site, the school as a whole is set fair for an exciting and vibrant future.
