### Lesson 1:

#### LO: To be able to rewrite a story

## Lesson 2:

#### LO: To be able to write an alternative ending to a story

SC: I can change the ending of a story

I can write my ideas down in sentences

I can use punctuation correctly

I can use the correct past tense words

# Changing the end of the story...

What if you were the author of 'Can't you sleep Little Bear?'

How would you change the story? Discuss with an adult.

Today we will be thinking about how we would change the end of the story.

After Big Bear takes Little Bear outside, Little Bear falls asleep and they come back inside. What if...

...Little Bear wants to go to the moon?

...Little Bear wants to play in the snow?

...Big Bear falls asleep instead?

...Little Bear *still* can't sleep?

Remember you do not have to rewrite the whole story - I just want you to change the end of the story.

Have a look at my example on the next slide to give you an idea



#### Note to Parents -

the children can use the beginning few sentences in italics to help them begin their writing...

Challenge: Can your child think of some dialogue they could include in their writing? How can they up level their writing by using better adjectives or vocabulary?

Little Bear pointed to the cave entrance and said "I am scared of the dark out there!" So Big Bear picked him up and took him outside. They looked at the moon...

When suddenly Little Bear did not feel sleepy anymore! In fact, he was so excited to see the bright moon. He jumped out of Big Bear's arms and started to roll around in the snow. He made snowballs and launched them at Big Bear. Big Bear laughed and pretended to fall to the ground. They made snow angels and a snowman too! After some time, Little Bear felt sleepy and finally they went back inside the cave to drink some hot chocolate before going to sleep.

## Lesson 3:

#### LO: To be able to write a book review

SC: I can understand the story of Can't you sleep Little Bear?

I can give my opinion

I can use reasoning in my writing

I can compose sentences that make sense

I can use conjunctions 'and' and 'because' to extend my writing

## Questions to consider

Use these questions to help you in your writing:

- 1. What did you think of the book? Did you like it?
- 2. Who was your favourite character? Why?
- 3. What do you do to help you sleep at night?
- 4. Would you tell your friend to read the book? Why?

Note to parents: think about how your child can extend their sentence by using 'because' to give reasons to their answers. Refer your child back to the letter they wrote to Little Bear - how can they link question 3 with helping Little Bear to sleep?

## Lesson 4:

LO: To be able to answer questions based on a text

SC: I can read the text


I can read the question (with support if necessary)
