This is called a compass rose. North West East South Back

Naughty Elephants Squirt Water is a good way to remember North, East, South and West. Most maps will have a compass rose placed in the corner. It shows the direction of North, East, South and West.


When reading maps we use what is called directional language, such as North, South, East and West. It helps us describe the location of features and routes on maps.

Other directional language we may use is: forward, back, up, down, above, below, behind and in front.







If the pirates travelled south they would get to the cave!


The crocodile would need to travel two squares north.
