


Lesson 4 Layered Collage Artwork



What do you notice about these pieces of artwork?












This piece of art style is known as photomontage, a type of collage, that uses photographic images as well as cut shapes.

This particular piece was created as part of the Dada movement. **Dadaist** artists expressed their discontent toward violence, war, and nationalism.



This is also a piece of photomontage. Here you can see torn newspaper, painted shapes and textures and the use of words. The items are layered and arranged by the artist. They are also drawn or painted using various techniques.




This is the work of well-known artist Henri Matisse.

It is also a piece of collage. Here you can see an arrangement of cut or torn shapes. You could use this technique for your artwork.

However, your artwork **must** have a powerful message and not just look pretty...




This is also a piece of layered collage. Here you can see the artist Susan Reedy has use headlines from newspapers and magazines and torn, layered, stuck and painted over them to create texture. This is a way of using typography and words.




These are also examples of photomontage by graphic designer Temi Coker.

These are created digitally using a computer.



Here, Katie Wohl has used colourful, abstract background and painted a silhouette of a well known black activist and used a powerful quote to create a powerful piece of artwork.

You could think about the background being a collage.



This layering technique is experimental, creating texture as well as a way in which to express an idea or a theme.

Our theme is BLACK LIVES MATTER: STAND TOGETHER




Using this technique You will be creating your own piece of artwork to communicate a powerful message on the theme STANDING TOGETHER.



Using typography - what would you want to say on your artwork? What would be your message?

Would you use a quote, a poem newspaper headlines, names, a phrase, a selection of powerful vocabulary?



Would you use a images, painting or drawn or cut shapes, recognisable and relevant imagery?

You need to think about the vocabulary and images you want to use.



The collage could be the main focus of your artwork or the background to your message.

Lesson 4 RESOURCES

As we don't know what resources you have available – here is a suggested list of items you may have around the house or you can easily get.

Large sheet of paper or card

Or Cereal box (you could use the card as the canvas)

Coloured paper or card – if you don't have coloured paper you could use magazines or newspaper or create your own coloured paper by colouring in white sheets and cutting and tearing these)

Paints

Coloured Pencils (or other drawing tools)

Glue

Newspapers / magazines – using topical imagery of protests and headlines may be useful Cellotape
