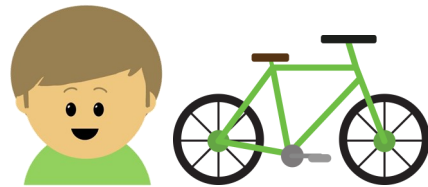

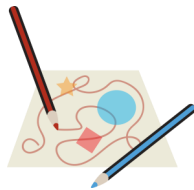

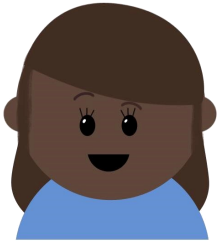

Anita says she has underlined the expanded noun phrase in her sentence.

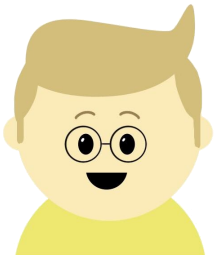


On Saturday, we rode our scooters beside the long, winding river.

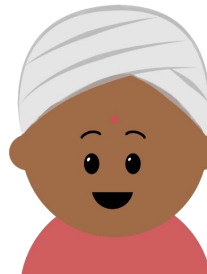
