#### **Phonics**

## Reading

Reading is an essential part of children's learning across all subjects. However, understanding what is being read is even more important. We will be using 'Reading Dogs' to assist the children with their comprehension. The 'Reading Dogs' are:



Each 'dog' focuses on different aspects of reading and understanding. The activities and homework we will set will focus on one or more of these aspect of reading in our attempt to make your child a holistic reader. You will receive more information about these in the new academic year.

We have sent you a document titled 'Year 1 Questions for Reading Bookmark Question Cards'. Please print these, stick them back to back, laminate or cover them and use them as a bookmark whilst reading with your children.

### **Key Learning Resources**

Please use the resources over the next few pages to help your child to familiarise themselves with numbers, sounds and words we will be focusing on in year 1. We notice many children are incorrectly forming some letters (such as 'b' , 'd' , 'q') particularly when writing their names, and some numbers as well (such as '3' , '2' , '5' , '6' , '7' , '9'). These resources are an attempt to give the children a head start over the summer as they prepare for year 1.





#### **Phonic Sounds**

All children have been taught these sounds in Reception, however, it is natural over the summer holiday the children may forget so practising them over the holiday period is helpful for their development. It is crucial they remember these sounds as it is the basis of their **reading** and **writing/spelling**. The children are encouraged to write words containing the Phase 2,3 and 5 sounds. We will also work on them at school in our daily phonic lessons. We will move onto Phase 5 and beyond (for most of the children) in the second half of the Autumn term.







**Common Exception Words -** Children should know how to read and spell these words. They can practice writing simple sentences using these words and reading it back to check they make sense:
