

Tuesday One Less Activity Sheet – optional worksheet (you can choose which parts to do or have a go at it all)

Task:

Provide children with their own 0-5 number line.

- Practise simple one less sums using a number line
- Adult can give children different sums to solve using the number line (one less than 3 or  $3 - 1 =$ )
- Extend your child by giving them word problems, see if they can show their reasoning using the number line



1 less than 5 is	$5-1=$
1 less than 4 is	$4-1=$
1 less than 3 is	$3-1=$
1 less than 2 is	$2-1=$
1 less than 1 is	$1-1=$
1 less than 0 is (is it possible?)	Can you spot the pattern?

3 monkeys on the bed, 1 fell off and hurt his head..how many monkeys are on the bed?	
Mark has 3 slices of pizza, he eats 2 slices. How many slices are left? How many less/ jumps did you do?	
5 cupcakes minus 1 cupcake is? Is there more or less?	
Mummy gave me one chocolate piece, then I ate my chocolate. How many pieces are left?
