Some interesting statistics about reading during lockdown:

- Children's enjoyment of reading has **increased** during lockdown (from 47.8% pre-lockdown to 55.9% post-lockdown)
- 47% of parents say their children are doing more independent reading since the first lockdown
- 34% of parents say they are reading to their children more
- 11% of parents read their child a bedtime story for the first time ever during lockdown (National Literacy Trust and Book Trust findings)
