

Year 1 Spellings (Autumn 1 – September 2021)

Please see the spellings below which need to be learnt for the children's weekly homework. They will be tested every Friday.

Please help your child to produce exciting sentences, which are grammatically correct and encourage them to use the correct tense and adjectives. It is important that they try to come up with their own sentences. Please discuss ideas with them as this will encourage them in this regard. This does not need to be sent to us into school – we will assess them every Friday during their spelling tests.

We have given the spellings for the whole half term as we know some parents are keen to work ahead but note we will not give further spellings.

It is important that children do not 'memorise' the spellings but develop their understanding of the phonic sounds, decoding and blending, to enhance their reading, spelling and writing. One key way of teaching them is to use sound buttons.

For example, the word **sheep** is spelt using the sounds **sh-ee-p**, the word **plum** is spelt using the sounds **p-l-u-m**, etc. Please see the school's website for more information.

We have however added some Common Exception Words (CEW) to the spelling list. These are the same as tricky words, words that **cannot** be decoded or sounded out.

Week 2 spellings will be tested on the same week, please do not panic. We understand that it is their first full week and we will adapt spellings to support pupils. However, we do highly encourage you to practice these words with your child on a daily basis (reading and writing).
