

We are incredibly proud of the resilience and strength of character shown over the last two weeks. When we consider the degree of change and uncertainty our pupils have been faced with, it is all the more remarkable how well they have settled into old routines.

All classes have now made a start with their community focused projects and have been using their focus texts of 'The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse' by Charlie Mackesy and texts celebrating the achievements of Sir Captain Tom Moore to explore concepts such as empathy, hope and strength of character.

World Book Day was a lovely way to welcome all the pupils back. With a whole-school focus on reading, this day proved a wonderful way to celebrate and promote the love and culture of reading. As time passes, we will be continuing our work in school and supporting pupils at home to develop our reading provision to encourage a love of reading at home as well as in school.

Finally, I am very excited to be able to share details regarding future plans to develop our library. With a very kind donation from the PTFA, we have started the process of re-imagining the current library space. With the PTFA's contribution, we will be commissioning more artwork for the library and Chantry Hall as well as investing in new books and some wonderful furniture. We want the children to have a space where they can sit down, read, and escape to a world of new possibilities - meeting new characters and developing a love of books and reading.

Secondary School Update

Firstly I would like to say a big well done and thank you to all the year 7 and 8 pupils who have stepped up to the new behaviour Expectations in KS3. Lessons are calm and purposeful and there is a lovely atmosphere around the school during break and lunch times.

We are reintroducing a full tutor programme from Monday 22nd March so please can all KS3 and KS4 pupils make sure they are arriving for the gate opening at 8:40 so they can be in tutor time for 8:45 sharp. Pupils arriving after 8:45 will be marked late.

The tutor period will start on Mondays with the restart of the home-learning routine. Students in KS3 will receive a home-learning pack every Monday which will need to be completed and brought back in the following Monday. Students who fail to complete the home-learning will be need to attend a catch up session on Wednesday after school to complete it.

Once a week we will hold an Avanti Way assembly in tutor time which is an opportunity for the students to discuss and think about the core principles underlying the Avanti ethos: Academic Excellence, Character Formation and Spiritual Insight.

The other tutor sessions will focus on reading.

For year 11 we have the start of our mock exams next week. There has been a minor change to the exam timetable which the children have been told about. Music has moved forward to the Monday and has swapped with the Spanish and Mandarin reading exam. The RS exam has been moved to the first Monday after the Easter holidays to give the new teacher Ms Burchell time to prepare the students and allow them to revise the right topics.



For years R – 6 these will be held on the 29^{th} and 30^{th} of March from 3.45pm – 6.45pm. Year 7 meetings will be held on the 30^{th} March only, and and Year 8 meetings on the 29^{th} March only both from 4.00 - 6.00pm

The meetings are 5 minute, online slots with your child's teacher/subject teacher - (years 7 & 8), and will provide you with the opportunity to discover what your children have been doing in class and discuss their progression.

PUNCTUALITY

From 8th March until 18th March, we have had 61 instances of late arrival in school! **Our target for lateness is zero.**

Children who arrive late in school not only miss vital settling in time and an opportunity to find out plans for the school day, but also occasionally the start of their first lesson. The vast majority of children are never late to school. Whilst we accept that there can be genuine reasons for lateness, we would not expect this to be more than occasional.

Good habits start young, and children often reflect adults' attitudes to school attendance and punctuality when they become teenagers and have more say in whether they attend or not and whether they are on time or not.

Please let us know if you are having difficulties getting your child to school on time and would appreciate some support, we are happy to help.

ATTENDANCE

Our average attendance since we welcomed the children back into school on the 8th of March has been: 94.1% **Our target is 97.0%**

Regular attendance assists the pupils in their ongoing learning and supports their social interactions with peers, it enables them to fully participate as a valued member of the class community.

Thank you for all the efforts you make to get your children to school on time each day, let's see if we can clock up less lates in the next two weeks.
