



JAMIE'S MTB CHALLENGE UPDATE - Summer 2022 tbc - UPDATE - commencing wb/ 22/8/22 - Monday 22nd August 2022

I have been blessed to work with WHY (We Hear You) yet again. This charity is awesome, they are fantastic for the local community and for the wider issues in which they tackle, and which affect us all the world over.

They have helped me with bereavement counselling since my mum passed away in 2018. They help with families and individuals who have been through the trauma of fatal illnesses and disease.

My goal is to climb (on my mountain bike) 36,201ft (the equivalent elevation gain as the depth of the Mariana Trench) to raise funds for WHY and in honour of my mum. That's over 6000ft higher than Mt Everest and one of the toughest challenges I know of. I aim to do the challenge in a week. Exact date and location are yet decided but I am looking for a suitable place as local as possible with the aim of doing this next spring/summer.

I have estimated it will be 12 hours of climbing, 16/18hrs in the saddle, it will take me over 100 miles of climbing so will be my first century MTB ride. It will be close to 400 miles in total.

I'm wanting to complete the challenge in similar style to Everesting - so will be up and down the same hill section multiple times to complete the challenge and gain the elevation - I aim to do an Everesting challenge at the same time then I will rest for the last push of 6000+ft.

Considering Gare Hill - with 300+ft elevation gain, it's a slog of a long climb at over 1 mile long and not a local mountain bikers favourite by far but the run downhill will be fast and should last a bit, it's straight so no berms or off camber corners. It's a fire road, smooth and in good condition so should run nice both ways making for a good option. I wanted something more extreme for the downhill but it's a fine balance between climbing 20% plus gradients all day and having a more mellow DH run.

More information on the challenge, Everesting and the Mariana Trench can be found on the link below – please show your support and feel free to take part on the day/week. I will be seeking local sponsorship and support from Pronto, WHY and Frome FM as well as drawing on contact in the MTB world – special support from Dirtwarz UK (top UK MTB, jump, stunt and slope style event). I hope to gather a group of riders (mainly local) to take part in this challenge and gain maximum fundraising, support and exposure.

Rough order of events

Monday 22nd – Everesting (riding until the challenge is complete) Tuesday/Wednesday – Sunday completing rest of MTB challenge (Tuesday-Wednesday will be recovery and sleep)

Chicken pox and scarlet fever



We are reminding parents and carers of the symptoms of both scarlet fever and chickenpox following a rise in cases across the country. Levels for both infections are in line with what we expect to see at this time of year, but there has been an increase compared to 2021 when measures during the pandemic such as social distancing, enhanced hygiene and school and nursery closures kept cases below average.

The first signs of scarlet fever are flu-like symptoms such as:

- High temperature
- Sore throat and swollen neck glands
- A bumpy, rough feeling rash usually appears after 12 to 48 hours on the chest and tummy.

If you think your child is showing signs of scarlet fever it's important to contact your local GP or <u>NHS</u> 111. Stay away from nursery, school or work for 24 hours after taking the 1st dose of antibiotics.

An itchy, spotty rash is the main symptom of chickenpox. Other symptoms include:

- a high temperature
- aches and pains
- and generally feeling unwell.

Stay away from work, nursery or school until all spots have formed scabs.

Traffic and Pedestrian Management Plan

Please see below a copy of the school *Traffic and Pedestrian Management Plan* details of which have been in place since the school first opened in Frome in September 2014. Please can we ask all parents to read this carefully. Many thanks, the Avanti Park Health & Safety Team.

TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN MANAGEMENT PLAN

Pedestrian Movement:

We ask all parents to ensure their children walk, cycle or scoot to school where possible.

Parents, pupils, and staff are asked to use the pavements and to be thoughtful about other pedestrians' using Park Road.

Pupils on scooters and bikes are requested to walk their bikes once they reach the boundaries of the school, at the main school entrance and down the school road to the pond gate.

There are several stone and brick walls bordering the school grounds including a low wall on the edge of the neighbouring Christchurch Parish Hall. We request that parents do not let their children walk along these walls as we cannot guarantee their safety.

No pedestrians to walk to or from the pond gate through the car park

Vehicle Movement:

As a school community our aim is to limit vehicles entering Park Road as it is a no through road and there is very limited parking on the road. We request that parents driving from a distance to the school park in one of the local car parks or in the surrounding area and walk their children into school.

Limiting vehicle movement is important for:

- Safety of pupils and parents
- Safety of other pedestrians and Park users
- Being good neighbours to people who live and work on Park Road
- Vehicle use of the Car Park:

There is no drop off parking at the school site for parents except by special arrangement.

There are four drop off spaces and three disabled spaces that are for the use of pupils with access needs and these spaces need to be arranged with either the school Business manager or the school SENDCo

There is a one-way system in place in the car park and all vehicles will enter via the top entrance

All vehicles to drive at a maximum speed of 5mph

The car park will be assessed for safety in conditions of ice and snow and may on occasion be closed by the Health & Safety team in order to keep staff, pupils, and parents safe.

No vehicles will be allowed on site during the school day unless accompanied by two members of the Site and Health & Safety Team.
