

## **Curriculum Vision**







We believe that all learners are entitled to an education that equips them with the knowledge, skills and values they need and teaches them how they can contribute to a future that they want to live in.

The Early Years Framework and National Curriculum lie at the heart of what is taught at Avanti park School. Our curriculum ensures all children make good progress as they know and remember more over time. It is ambitious for children with SEND and those that are vulnerable in order to close any attainment gap.

We understand what children need to know and learn, and our curriculum ensures that every child achieves this and more. Learning has been sequenced in such a way to reduce cognitive load, link to prior learning and enable children to master new concepts.

When we teach the curriculum, we ensure that:

- Key concepts are repeated throughout the children's learning journey so that all children revisit and develop a deeper understanding of their learning.
- Knowledge organisers and notes are used in each unit so that it is clear what knowledge and understanding will be gained at each stage of learning.
- Subjects are taught discretely but links are made where appropriate to interconnect knowledge.
- Low stakes quizzes and end-of unit writing tasks are used to assess whether knowledge has been committed to the long term memory.

#### The Avanti Way

Our curriculum is underpinned by the Avanti Way: Educational Excellence, Spiritual Insight and Character Formation.

These values promote thinking as a global citizen and help to develop skills for young people to make meaningful contributions to society.

We enhance children's social, moral and character development with a variety of opportunities including being part of the school council, the eco committee, and becoming play leaders for younger children.

We promote a spiritual connection with themselves and the world around them with yoga and mindfulness, Winter and Spring Festival days, a dedicated art and design space and opportunities to learn outdoors in Forest School.




# Key Stage 3

## **Traffic and Pedestrian Management Plan**

Please see below a copy of the school *Traffic and Pedestrian Management Plan* details of which have been in place since the school first opened in Frome in September 2014. Please can we ask all parents to read this carefully. Many thanks, the Avanti Park Health & Safety Team.

### TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN MANAGEMENT PLAN

### **Pedestrian Movement:**

We ask all parents to ensure their children walk, cycle or scoot to school where possible.

Parents, pupils, and staff are asked to use the pavements and to be thoughtful about other pedestrians' using Park Road.

Pupils on scooters and bikes are requested to walk their bikes once they reach the boundaries of the school, at the main school entrance and down the school road to the pond gate.

There are several stone and brick walls bordering the school grounds including a low wall on the edge of the neighbouring Christchurch Parish Hall. We request that parents do not let their children walk along these walls as we cannot guarantee their safety.

No pedestrians to walk to or from the pond gate through the car park

### Vehicle Movement:

As a school community our aim is to limit vehicles entering Park Road as it is a no through road and there is very limited parking on the road. We request that parents driving from a distance to the school park in one of the local car parks or in the surrounding area and walk their children into school.

### Limiting vehicle movement is important for:

- Safety of pupils and parents
- Safety of other pedestrians and Park users
- Being good neighbours to people who live and work on Park Road
- Vehicle use of the Car Park:

There is no drop off parking at the school site for parents except by special arrangement.

There are four drop off spaces and three disabled spaces that are for the use of pupils with access needs and these spaces need to be arranged with either the school Business manager or the school SENDCo

There is a one-way system in place in the car park and all vehicles will enter via the top entrance

All vehicles to drive at a maximum speed of 5mph

The car park will be assessed for safety in conditions of ice and snow and may on occasion be closed by the Health & Safety team in order to keep staff, pupils, and parents safe.

No vehicles will be allowed on site during the school day unless accompanied by two members of the Site and Health & Safety Team.
