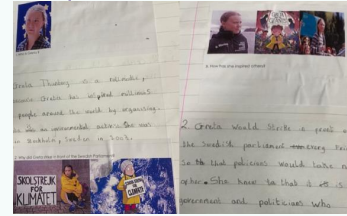
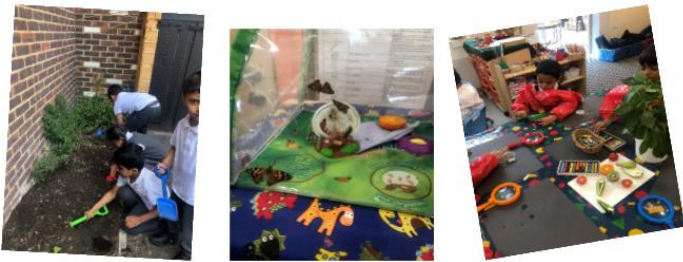
This week's learning at KAPSC...

Year 1

The children have been working really hard this week in all areas. We have carried out a few internal assessments in all classes in order to inform future planning in order to plug gaps in learning. In English we continued to read the book 'Stanley's stick' Children sequenced the main events in the story and retold the main events. In Maths we learnt about doubles and halves. In History we studied the environmental activist, Greta Thunberg. Our children were able to write about why Greta is considered to be a significant person

Reception

Reception have had an amazing week of learning after listening to the story of the 'Enormous Turnip'. The children thoroughly enjoyed role-playing the story before writing the story in their own words. In Maths, we begun learning about sharing in half. We had the experience of cutting in half and then sharing a number in half. On Wednesday, the children said 'Goodbye' to our lovely Butterflies that had been with us over the past four weeks. We also planted a number of flowers and vegetables. Towards, the end of the week, we cooked 'Vegetable Couscous' and also undertook some observational drawings of fruit and vegetables.



Year 2

This week has been eventful with work in English being centred around comparing features of two stories by Roald Dahl. We have also consolidated some of our understanding around shapes and their features. At the end of this week, we thought about the idea of 'being kind' and reflected on examples of when we ourselves might have been kind to our friends, family members, to the environment and so on.

Year 4

This week in Year 4, children have been working very hard in completing some termly assessments. I have been very impressed with their perseverance and courage to try their very best. In Science this week, we continued our learning about sound. We learnt about the different parts of the ear and the different functions of the outer, middle and inner ear.

"Did you know the smallest bone of the body can be found in our ears? It is called the stapes and it is also the lightest bone. It helps us process sound by transmitting vibrations to the inner ear." - Kesavan

Year 3

This week in Year 3, we have been very busy completing our termly assessments! However, we found some time to carry out a scientific experiment about light. We found out that light travels in straight light!

Also, we kept reading the fantastic and funny book "The Dinosaur's Diary" by Julia Donaldson. "I think it's great. I like all the names of the dinosaurs. I think the story is interesting, for example when the Euphocephalus beats the T-Rex. I liked the illustrations as well."
