

## **Home Learning**

### **Termly:**

 Curriculum Information sheets will be put on the website and on Google Classroom

### Weekly:

- Reading (books changed weekly)
- Spellings (Spelling Test on Tuesday)
- Homework posted on website and Google Classroom: (Sent out on Thursday, due back following Tuesday). This will consist of maths, a short reading task and a spelling list.
- Children will complete their learning and post on Google classroom.



- Please ensure that reading is logged in the children's reading logs as this will be check on a weekly basis Every Tuesday.
- Please refer to reading lists and reading guidelines which can be found under Year 5 in the <u>Reading and Phonics</u> Tab on the school website.
- Please ensure you make comments related to different aspects of reading for example comprehension, using the text as an inspiration for writing and vocabulary.
- It is your child's responsibility to organise themselves to do their homework but please assist them if they find the task difficult.
- Some reading strategies to use at home include: Decoding, Scanning, Inference and Retrieval.

#### Why Can't I Skip My 20 Minutes of Reading Tonight?

Student "A" reads 20 minutes each day

3600 minutes in a school year Student "B" reads 5 minutes each day

900 minutes in a school year Student "C" reads 1 minute each day

180 minutes in a school year

#### 1,800,000 words
