Teaching Assistant of the Term:

What is your favorite resource/ activity to do with the children? My favorite speech and language activity, in regards to teaching children, is "Mr Good guess". The way in which this game is played, is that an image is shown, of which there is a scenario and the child is then tasked with explaining what may have caused this; in short, it's a game of inference and explanation. The child thoroughly enjoyed it, particularly due to the interactive nature of the game. In my experience, children generally tend to always be more engaged when they are having fun which is why I think "Mr Good guess" has been such a success.

What have been some of the challenges? One of the biggest challenges I have faced is maintaining student engagement during learning. At times, students can get bored and switch off. I wanted to ensure the best approach to get the students to re-engage. This particularly was a challenge with one student due to their inability to focus for long periods of time. However, I implemented a plan where I would encourage the student to have regular movement and take sensory breaks. In terms of the task at hand, I would break it down into small steps to maintain student attention all the way to completion.

What do you enjoy about your role? My role as a teaching assistant is incredibly rewarding as it enables me to focus on individuals, helping them to reach their goals and most importantly being part of that process every step of the way. Sharing the joy and jubilation when they achieve their full potential fills me with a sense of pride.
