#### <u>Year 3 – Spring Block 2 – Prepositions – Prepositional Phrases</u>

#### **Notes and Guidance:**

- Once children are familiar with what a preposition is, they can begin writing prepositional phrases.
- In this step, children will begin to turn a simple preposition into a prepositional phrase.
- A prepositional phrase is a preposition followed by the object (noun, pronoun or noun phrase), for example: They ran down the hill, where 'down' is the preposition.
- Prepositional phrases can act as adjectives to describe a noun or pronoun or as adverbs to describe a verb, for example: Jack saw a monkey hiding in a tree.

- Use the preposition 'in' to create a prepositional phrase.
- What does this prepositional phrase express about the noun in this sentence?
- Underline the prepositional phrase in the sentence.
