

Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure Report

Krishna Avanti Primary School, Leicester

2020 to 2021



This report provides information on how the school used the Pupil Premium (PP) in the last academic year and the impact this had on our pupil's academic achievement and personal wellbeing. It also shows how we made sure that the provision for this group of pupils was of consistently high quality so that each action funded by PP should lead to improvements in pupils' development and learning and enable them to achieve high standards. In our school, we are ambitious for all our children and have high expectations of all. Every effort is made to ensure that the extra funding is used to best effect so that it makes a strong impact on children's learning, success and happiness.

The 2019 to 2020 academic year was interrupted in March with the COVID-19 pandemic. This created many challenges for all children, parents and staff. Many more children than those in receipt of pupil premium funding are likely to have been affected. The school worked extremely hard and was very pleased to have been able to roll out Google Classroom to every single child in the school by the first day of Lockdown and provide a full day's worth of education for every child throughout the academic year. This provision was planned for and delivered by the children's usual class teachers and continued the topics and work, as best they could, as they would have done had they physically been in class.

Specific barriers to education that our children face:

- Low literacy skills upon entry.
- Parents and family with very little English, unable to support with literacy work.
- Social and emotional difficulties and challenges
- Insufficient family engagement with their schooling.
