In 1945, the elements americium and curium (atomic numbers 95 and 96) was announced. Discovered by Glenn Seaborg in America, americium is used in smoke alarms. Extensive studies are taking place in its potential use in space craft batteries. Curium has already been used many times to power equipment on NASA space missions.
