2005, The Airbus A380, the world's largest commercial jet and nicknamed the 'Superjumbo', was unveiled at a ceremony in Toulouse, France. It is equipped with 100,000 different wires, totalling 530 kilometres, or 330 miles, in length, that perform 1,150 separate functions!

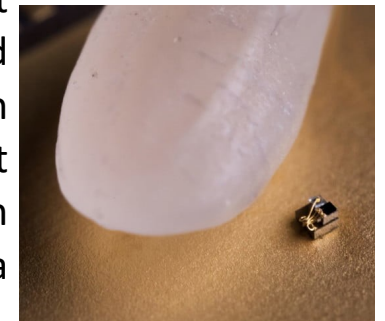
Go explore...
