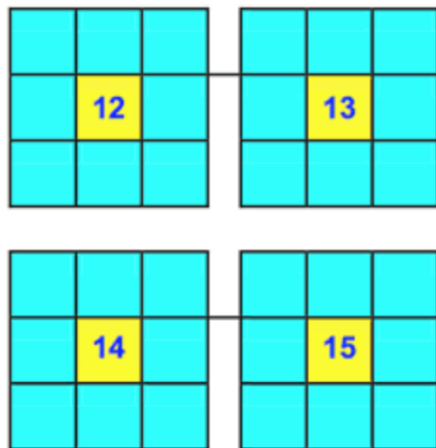


Did you know...

The numbers two and five are the only prime numbers that end with two and five.

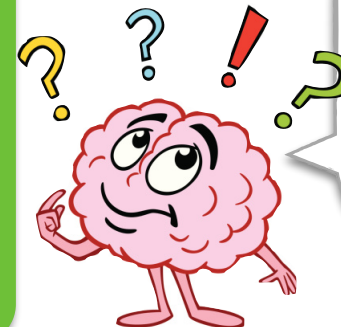


Go explore...
