TOP TIPS FOR HELPING YOUR CHILD TO READ:

- Allow children time to break down unfamiliar words into units of sound and then encourage children to string these sounds together to create the word.
- Encourage your child to point out any focus phonics when they are used.
- Read through the book more than once to grow confidence.
- Ask simple questions about the text to assess understanding.
- Encourage children to use illustrations as prompts.

“I know! We can cook a big dinner for the monsters on Earth,” said Zozo.




“That is a top plan. We can get food The Monster Cook Book. It has lots of cool food for all sorts of monsters,” said Jam.

The three monsters from the Moon started to cook. They made all sorts of disgusting foods that crunched and smelt for the monsters on Earth.




Soon, they had lots of food to bring down to Earth.




“To the rocket on the roof!” Zozo yelled.

They began to eat food from the lunchbox.




