Mary Seacole

Ignatius Sancho was born on a slave ship and was brought to England by his owner.


He worked as a butler but the man that he worked for realized Sancho was very clever and creative




Sancho wrote poetry, plays and music and spoke out against the slave trade too. He opened a shop in London where other creative minds could come together and meet.

At that time black people were not allowed to vote but Ignatius Sancho became the first known black British voter.

Mary Seacole was born in Jamaica. Mary's mother was a black woman but her father was a white man and 1805-1881 so she was born 'free' and not forced into slavery.





Mary cared for many people throughout her life and in 1853 she asked the British War Office to send her to the Crimea to care for wounded soldiers in the war. She was refused, and so she raised money to travel there herself and set up her own hospital, caring for the wounded. She was known as 'Mother Seacole' by those she tended to.
