On this day...

Nochebuena (literally "the Good Night") is a Spanish word referring to the night of Christmas Eve and celebrated on 24 December every year. Some regions include a fasting before midnight dinner.



Did you know...

Traditionally, Spanish people never celebrated Father Christmas coming to town in December. Instead, the presents are usually delivered to children on 6th January by the *Reyes Magos*, the Three Wise Men.
