

# Reception-Stort Class

This week we enjoyed reading the story 'Potion Commotion,' written by Peter Bently and Sernur Isik. We chose this book in particular becuase the children in Stort have been fascinated with potion making as of late and we wanted to follow their interests. This has given the children to chance to draw new friends for the dragon in the story, create stews of their own and practise pouring and mixing different magical concoctions.







OUR MATHS











We have been looking at patterns over the course of the week. The children deepened their understanding of what a pattern is by using different materials around the class to make patterns as well as learning a dance that is a repeating pattern. They can't wait to show everyone during our end of the year assembly!

## PHONIES FORUS:

Revising Set 1 sounds and adding Set 2 digraphs

As part of our enhanced provision this week, we provided the children with different glass bottles, mica powders, bicarbonate soda, vinegar and water for them to experiment with. Everyone loved mixing the different colours, using funnels to pour liquids from one container to another and watching the bubbles overflow when they combined different substances.



This week we are continuing our topic of 'Change is different but it is good", by thinking about different emotions, how we feel lots of different emotions and how we can support out friends.



This week's focus book of 'Rain Before Rainbows' is centred around a girl and her friend, the fox, who travel together from a dark place to a place full of light and colour. On their journey they face some tricky times and meet new friends who help and support them. The book focuses on the different emotions we face as we move from day to day.

<u>Language we drew attention to as we</u> read:

- daybreak
- decisions to make what is a decision? What decisions do we need to make?
- dragons to duel and battles to win – about overcoming our worries and fears thunder will rumble, lightning will flash – about feeling angry courageous –
- brave
- Sowing and planting, roots before shoot, stem before flower, leaf before fruit
- A day full of promise means an exciting day, anything can happen



RAIN BEFORE

In maths, the children have been consolidating their knowledge of number by exploring how numbers can be made in different ways, with the total remaining the same. As always, we have reinforced the learning through games and lots of rhymes.

This week our focus book has inspired lots of creative activities within our enhancements. The children have been drawn to discussions around rainbows and the changing weather outside so we have created our own rainbows through art, movement and calming moments. The children have also enjoyed using new rainbow coloured crystal magnetic polydrons and mega blocks. We even
