



Revising Set 1 sounds and adding Set 2 digraphs

We enjoyed reading 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson this week. The children learned all about worms and explored some sensory trays replicating worms in the outdoor area. We discussed lenght, using vocabulary such as longer and shorter. The children also had a go at measuring using nonstandard units. They measured things using their hands and their feet.











This week we are continuing our topic of 'Change is different but it is good", by thinking about how we are growing and have changed this year, and what is ahead of.

This week we have chosen to read and watch various stories connected to sports day to help us prepare for our own event and also to help us compare our experiences. We talked about the importance of taking part and trying things which we might find difficult. Impressing the notion; it's not the winning but the taking part that counts.

This week we felt the need to remind Lea class of the golden expectations. It is the period of transition. Children sense change, certain behaviours occur during this time. We spoke about 3. Be respectful. Children were tasked to work as a class to prepare for next year. Through choice of an activity, naturally some children thought it fun to wash toys, dressing up clothes, mud suits and cuddly toys. Most children opted to join in.



The scientific language from such an amazing opportunity was words such as absorbed, draining, floating, rinsing, melting (soap flakes). The water certainly changed from clear to muddy brown, so discussions about germs was discussed. . It was also lovely to hear the children naturally talking about helping others, being kind to next years cohort, them moving up into reception, and processing the changes for next year in their own words.

Tuesday saw the arrival of our much anticipated sports afternoon! As expected, the rain came, meaning we had to move the celebrations inside. Although it was noisy and busy, the children seemed to enjoy themselves! A big thank you goes to all the parents and carers who were there to support and share the event with the children.
