Dear Families,



DR MOLLY WAR-RINGTON TRUST BOARD MEMBER VISITS AVANTI

Avanti Trust Board member Dr Molly Warrington visited Avanti Court and said: 'I saw children engaged in literacy and numeracy lessons. In one class they were learning new vocabulary and how to use it, not just in writing, but in their daily lives. In another class children were working through questions about fractions: each child chose which level to attempt and worked through the different problems. I walked round a few desks in each classroom, looking at small sample of the children's books and talking to some children. Each child was able to explain with confidence exactly what they were doing and why. They seemed engaged and interested in their work, and in all the classrooms I visited there was a sense of purposefulness and a feeling of calm.

It was clear to me that not only were the children studying core subjects of the national curriculum at levels which seemed to challenge them appropriately, but that the school also embraced the wider curriculum, including an emphasis on the creative arts. The Avanti ethos clearly permeated the school.'

Safeguarding pupils

Information regarding policies and procedures at Avanti Court Primary School to enable the safety of our school community.

Parental support

In the morning, pupils in Year 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 may enter into the building at 8:20am. Pupils in Reception are met by their teacher outside the Reception area and are taken into class at 8:20am ready to start lessons. The main gates will be closed / locked at 8:30am in the morning and will not be opened again until 3.00pm. Pupils are dismissed at 3:10pm. The gates are then locked again at 3.20pm. In order to support the security of the school, it is important you are punctual at the start and end of the school day and leave the site promptly so that the caretaker can secure the site. Members of the Senior Leadership team are on duty in the morning before school and after school.

Each class has a designated collection point at the end of the school day and any uncollected children will be taken to late collection at 3.20pm and parents are asked to enter the main reception area and to sign their child out. If your child is to be collected by someone else on any particular day, then please notify the class teacher or a member of staff in the office. Please do not take other children without the authority of the parent and prior notification.

If your child is unwell, please phone the school office on the first day of absence and leave a message. Please also ensure that your child has everything that they need that day as office staff cannot be expected to deliver items around the school. All these helpful strategies will enable the office staff to be extra vigilant.

Site security

To keep the school safe, we check all visitors before authorising entry on to the site. All school staff and visitors have to sign in and are issued with ID lanyards. The school monitors the external CCTV cameras on the site and challenge any strangers.

Staff training

All members of staff have received training on emergency evacuation procedures and the whole school community participates in practice drills to reinforce these evacuation procedures in the event of an emergency.

All members of staff have undertaken safeguarding training including the Prevent Strategy, which is the government's agenda for preventing children from radicalisation. Online safety training has also been delivered to the children.

Playtimes

Children are fully supervised during playtimes by members of staff on duty each day. If a child is injured, then they will be taken to the medical area for attention with a trained First Aider.

Bullying

As a school community we do not tolerate any form of bullying and act on all reports of incidents. We regularly talk to pupils about the definition of bullying and what strategies and support is in place to keep pupils safe.

Operation Encompass

Avanti Court is taking part in a project run jointly between schools and the Metropolitan Police Service. This project is known as Operation Encompass. Operation Encompass is the notification to schools that a child (under 18) has been exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a specially trained member of the school staff, known as a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL), is informed. The DSL can then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to ensure the wellbeing of the child.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Please ensure your children arrive at school on time. Currently, two members of staff are on duty daily to escort late children to their classes after 8:30am. We would prefer that these two members of staff were used to support learning.

Did you know that from 8:20-8:45am in Years 1,2,3,4,5 and 6 children use this time to respond to teacher marking?

Research has proved that children who respond to teacher feedback make more progress than their peers.

As a school, we wanted to achieve 97% attendance for the Spring term. We have managed to reach 95.9%. This is below the National Average and Ofsted will not grade the school good if attendance is low. We are expecting Ofsted to revisit the school in order to get an outstanding grading so please help us to reach 97%

There are a number of families who have decided to go abroad during term time, which is having an impact on not only their children's academic success but on our whole school attendance.

DIVERSITY





On Tuesday 26th February Year 2 took part in Africa day! Pupils experienced a range of activities from African dance to learning key words from different African languages. Thank you to Mrs Walters for leading the African Dance session, Ms Vincent for leading African music and Mrs Bana for delivering an inspiring celebratory session on different languages from Africa. The Year 2 teaching team created a fantastic day so that children are engaged and enthused about their new topic!











YOGA AT AVANTI

Children worked through a range of poses called the happy and sad cat pose. Children were able to show they were in a happy pose by stretching tall.

They started the session by deep breathing. This is really helpful because it helps children to feel calm and gives them space and time. To help the children focus Ms Donoghue encourages them to put on their concentration goggles before the lesson. She has explained to the children that the circular shape of the googles is continuous and like a ring cannot be broken.

Key language is also a focus of the sessions and words such as: focus, resting, kneeling, inhale and posture are references through out the session.
