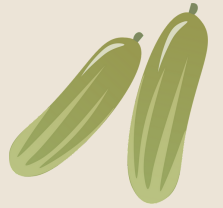

# **So what will the garden be used for?**

**Fresh produce, wildflowers and plants will feature in the 400m<sup>2</sup> space, which is being designed by Wildscapes, a co-operatively run, not-for-profit Community Interest Company.**

**There'll be benches and ample walking space too, with a focus on water conservation and climate education. Pupils will be able to incorporate using the garden into aspects of the school curriculum, as well as those on the school gardening club.**


**As part of our ethos and commitment to the environment and community service, volunteers will encourage local community groups, gardening clubs and residents to use the space for their physical and mental health and wellbeing.**

**The PTFA will be working closely with local care homes in the area to arrange for residents to regularly visit the garden, and for pupils to deliver to them fresh produce once harvested.**


**Mental health charities, the local Scouts group and gardening clubs will also be able to enjoy the facilities of the new community garden.**
