We've had another busy week in Year 2. The children have been working really hard on their reading. Thank you all for your continued support - Miss Jeffries and I appreciate it.



Foxglove


English: Year 4 have been continuing their work with D.E.R.I.C.

Maths: Building on last week's Base Ten and Number Line work, Year 4 are now using Place Value to develop their problem-solving skills.

Science: Year 4 have been learning about the variety of animal diets and the teeth needed to support dietary needs.



Topic: It is expedition time! Class 4 are currently planning an overland journey from Bristol to Australia. Using an atlas and world map they are documenting the countries they would travel through to reach the land down under. Which route would you take?

We are now almost halfway through the first term, thank you for your ongoing support and working with the children on their homework and getting letters returned quickly.

Our maths this week has seen us recapping on addition we have done written questions and arithmetic ones. As a class we have been working on strategies of using the vocabulary in the questions to help us solve them.

Within English we have been re-writing and editing our stories, we have been working on adding descriptive language and a wider range of punctuation. Spellings and handwriting are an ongoing challenge as we try to improve them both.

In science we carried out our practical experiment causing a chemical reaction, this enabled us to identify whether it is a reversible or irreversible change. The children enjoyed the rocket launching using vitamin C tablets.

In this coming week we have our zoom session with the Mayor of Bristol, the children have written some interesting questions for him to answer, I am looking forward to hearing his responses!


WOW WORK OF THE WEEK:

Year 2:



Year 4:


Theo has impressed Mrs Painter by publishing his narrative based on the Papaya that Spoke.
