
A Great Bristol Elephant Adventure

• Many of you will have seen Mr Ryan our Caretaker this morning standing on the road opposite the car park gate to prevent people from parking on the double yellow lines and in front of resident's driveways. He was there from 8:30am until the gates closed at 8.45 and sadly, he did have to speak to many parents about their parking.

Since we have been back following Christmas, I have had several emails from residents about how parents seem to think it is acceptable to park across drives and even worse, park on people's drives.

• The yellow lines are there to make it safe to cross the road and when people park further away it is much safer for everyone. The example that parents are setting their children by parking irresponsibly is not acceptable.

• I am pleased that most of you are very happy to see Mr Ryan safeguarding our children near the roadside and protecting the safety of the residential area, but we shouldn't have to be doing this and we should not have to keep reminding parents about dangerous or disrespectful parking.

• One of our school virtues is responsibility; thank you to all of you that demonstrate this virtue every day.



Learning Highlights KS1


KS1 have been learning about how to stretch themselves in their learning and about persevering! They made these hands which required them to challenge themselves and persevere. They really enjoyed this activity!
