LETTER FROM MR PENNY

Dear families of Avanti Gardens,

Welcome back to the start of Term 2, I hope that you had a restful and enjoyable half-term. It has been a great start back! The INSET day for teachers was an informative trust-wide day of Continued Professional Development (CPD), led by guest speakers but also by our brilliant colleagues from around the Avanti Trust including our very own EYFS lead Ms Corcoran. It has also been brilliant to see so many of you joining teachers for Parents Evening discussions. We have a really exciting term ahead of us planned, so please look out for further communications.

I would like to highlight that I am aware of a number of children who have access to WhatsApp, which has a minimum age of use in the UK and Europe of 16 years old. WhatsApp's main purpose is to send messages to friends — it isn't public in the same way that Twitter is, and people can only message friends normally who have contacts added to their phones. This is however not the case with groups, which allows over 500 people to chat in one conversation stream. I appreciate that as parents you can't always control if your child is added to a group chat; but I would ask that you remind children that they are always in control of their own participation; that they can leave a group whenever they want; and ask that you monitor the content of these group regularly. I would like to signpost you to the following website which has further information:

NSPCC KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE ONLINE. IS WHATSAPP SAFE FOR MY CHILD?

I am sure you are all aware of the recent and ongoing events in Israel and Palestine, many people within our community have close friends and family who are being directly impacted by the conflict. Whilst as a school (following advice from the DfE) we remain non-political, we have chosen this week to educate our children about the current events and to discuss the impact this has on the people who live there in an age-appropriate way.

With the colder and wetter weather now very much upon us, I would ask that all children come dressed appropriately for the changing weather. We endeavour to make the most of our outdoor spaces in all but the most extreme weather conditions (as we know how important time outside is), however appropriate clothing is vital for this to happen. A reminder also of the ongoing expectation that all children should be wearing school uniform. It is part of our identity as part of the Avanti

Trust and therefore by attending Avanti Gardens families are part of that identity. A reminder that we have extensive second-hand uniform available in the school office; you can purchase an Avanti Badge which can be attached to a blue jumper; we are happy to meet with individuals to discuss SEND related adaptions to uniform; and we can help financially with any family in receipt of Pupil Premium funding.

Our School Website will soon have class specific pages which will contain specific year group information about term. These pages will be primarily as a point of information but also for celebrating the amazing learning that is happening in classes — therefore any feedback once they are up and running about how these could be made more informative is always welcome.

Every week as a school we explore Spiritual Insight through the sharing of a 'Big Question'. These questions provide the stimulus to meaningful and stimulating, positive and enjoyable conversations which help us to understand our own views about ourselves and others, our relationships, and our lives and beliefs. You will find these 'Big Questions' in the weekly bulletin and we encourage you to discuss them with your children at home.



To qualify for funding, you must meet all the following criteria:

- Owner occupier and privately owned properties only
- Combined annual household income on or below £31,000
- An energy performance certificate rating of D, E, F or G.
 If you don't have one, please still apply
- · The property must NOT use mains gas central heating
- You must live in Bristol, North Somerset or Bath and North East Somerset
- You may automatically qualify for funding based on your postcode, regardless of your income.

Bristol City Leap to deliver £11 million of energy efficiency upgrades for fuel poor homes Over 500 households in Bristol, North Somerset and Bath & North East Somerset (BANES) are to receive funding for energy efficiency and renewable upgrades to help tackle fuel poverty and cut carbon emissions. The 'Bright Green Homes' project will be delivered across the South West, by Bristol City Leap, an innovative new partnership between Bristol City Council and Ameresco, designed to bring in investments of nearly £500 million in low carbon energy projects and create over 1000 jobs in its first five years. Energy efficiency upgrades will be determined on a case by case basis and will range from insulation measures like loft and cavity wall, to the installation of renewable and low carbon technologies such as solar panels and heat pumps. Households can apply via the Bristol City Leap website where they will complete a short questionnaire to determine their eligibility. Home improvements for eligible households will be installed by Bristol City Leap partner, Ameresco from March 2023 and continue until 2025. The three councils successfully bid for funding from phase 2 of the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero's home upgrade grant which has already provided over £1.1 billion to low income households living in the worst quality, off-gas grid homes in England. The latest round of funding will help to reduce the carbon footprint of homes, while providing support to hundreds of households in the south west struggling with energy bills. David White, Operations Director for Bristol City Leap, commented: "We are delighted that Bristol has been successful in the most recent round of the Home Upgrade

Grant scheme. We were able to make a much larger bid than in previous funding rounds due to the additional delivery capability that Bristol City Leap can bring to bear through the partnership between Bristol City Council and Ameresco. As a result, our Bright Green Homes project will help reduce the energy bills of over 500 families in Bristol, Bath and North East Somerset and North Somerset, whilst

also tackling the climate emergency and creating local jobs." The

The announcement by Department for Energy Security and Net Zero's marks the third time in three years that Bristol City Council has received funding for residents in low energy efficiency and lowincome households and builds on the hundreds of homes already benefitting from improved energy efficiency. Councillor Kye Dudd, Cabinet Member for Climate, Ecology, Waste and Energy in Bristol, said: "I know many people are deeply concerned about the cost of heating their homes and rising energy bills, so I'm glad that we have secured even more funding through the government's Home Upgrade Grant "This funding is an essential part of Bristol's commitment to become a carbon neutral city and it will also make a real difference to eligible residents in the city – saving them money on their household energy bills and making their homes more energy efficient through upgrades like better insulation. "If you think your household meets the eligibility criteria, then I urge you to complete the online questionnaire.
