Co-Curricular Clubs Programme - Mrs. Carr & Mr. Nichols **History Hunters**

History Hunters have been meeting fortnightly on a Wednesday. In our most recent meeting, we explored the surviving evidence for the very earliest black Britons, and the evidence for people of African origin in Britain during the Roman period. We learned about radiocarbon dating techniques and a DNA extraction and sequencing. We used our evidential skills to make inferences from the material remains of Ivory Bangle Lady, who lived in York during the Roman period, and the goods buried with her.
