Year 3 Art Project

Every year the Mayor of London invites London’s primary and secondary school children to create artworks inspired by the commissions for the Fourth Plinth. Teachers can submit their students’ work as individuals or groups, and designs can be made in any medium, including drawing, painting, sculpture, collage, digital and video. There are three age categories; 5-7 years, 8-11 years and 12-15 years. Our Year 3 pupils have been working with an artist, Emma Moore, to think about what they feel is important to them that will make a difference in the world as they see it. The five week project has produced amazing results and has also instigated lots of questions as to why things happen. The children have been focussing on social issues such as homelessness or raising awareness for the rain forests. Our entries have been submitted, fingers crossed our children have their work reproduced in two dimensions for an exhibition at City Hall in London; please see some of their work attached.
