

Curriculum Information Sheet Autumn Term 2 2019-2020

Class: Gentle Giraffes & Kind Kangaroos Year 3

THEMES	This half term is based around the theme of Black History
ENGLISH	During the half term we will be studying stories from other cultures, descriptive writing, dialogue, narrative writing and poetry.
	Key Texts: Journey to Joburg,
writing	We will be focusing on improving our own writing through weekly planning, drafting and editing. Emphasis will continue to be placed on improving children's comprehension skills, particularly inference, deduction and text dissection. We will also be focusing heavily on spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG). The key areas we will be covering are listed below:
	Consistent use of capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks in sentence writing. Consistent use of a range of connectives to join words and clauses.
	 Present perfect form of verbs e.g. He has gone out to play contrasted with He went out to play.
	 Spelling words with the 'k' sound spelt 'ch' e.g. scheme, school, echo. Using the prefixes un-, dis-, mis-, re-, pre Using adverbs and adverbials
	 Use of fronted adverbials Creating compound and complex sentences
	 Using and punctuating direct speech correctly in a variety of texts
	 Understanding when to us a/an in front of a word
	Handwriting
	Increase legibility, consistency and quality of handwriting.

MATHS	Each week the children will be challenged on the key areas of Year 3 maths. The principal focus is to ensure the children become increasingly fluent with whole numbers and the four operations, including number facts and the concept of place value.

- To explore the requirements of plants for life and growth and how they vary from plant to plant.
- To investigate the way in which water is transported within plants.
- To explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

The principal focus of science teaching in lower Key Stage 2 is to enable pupils to broaden their scientific view of the world around them. They will do this through exploring, talking about, testing, developing ideas about everyday phenomena and the relationships between living things and familiar environments. They will begin to develop their ideas about functions, relationships and interactions.

TOPIC WORK (Geography)



Our geography topic for this half term is Investigating our local area

We will be encouraging children to take a look at their local area as they explore the features of the community.

Throughout their geography learning this half term we will be focusing on:

- using maps to spot familiar places and give directions to and from local points of interest
- examine services in the local area and create a survey of jobs and travel
- consolidating knowledge by evaluating their local area and provide information for visitors

Philosophy Religion and Ethics Education

Theme: Communicating with the divine

Pupils will learn about the meaning of prayer. They will focus in more depth on the power and meaning of meditation (exploring the similarities and differences of chanting the Maha Mantra with chants from other traditions: Om Mane Padme Hum, Allah Hoo, Nam yo ho renghe kyo, Hail Mary) as an individual and collective practice. They will ask questions about the nature of the Divine: e.g. How can we make contact with Krishna? Does He listen? How do we know? This will lead to a knowing about Deities and the process of serving them in the Hindu tradition, particularly those related to Krishna in the Chaitanya tradition.

PERFORMING ARTS

Music

Year 3 will be working with a specialist teacher from Harrow Music Service to develop their musical skills.
