THEMES	This term our learning is based around the theme of Let there be light.

MATHS	<ul> <li>Each week the children will be challenged on key areas of the Year 5 maths curriculum. The principal focus of mathematics teaching in Upper Key Stage 2 is to ensure that pupils extend their understanding of the number system and place value to include larger integers. We will be developing their skills in: <ul> <li>multiplication,</li> <li>division,</li> <li>fractions,</li> <li>algebra,</li> <li>ratio,</li> <li>proportion.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
SCIENCE	We will be learning about <b>Earth and Space</b> for our half term Science topic. There is an emphasis on asking scientific questions, developing investigative skills and writing up investigations. For our topic on Earth and Space we will be learning about:
