

## Maths Homework - Year 3 (Due Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> November)

Next week we will be continuing to look at addition and subtraction of up to three digit numbers.

### Collecting Points Game

This activity helps your child to be able to quickly say how many to the next multiple of ten (number ending in 0).

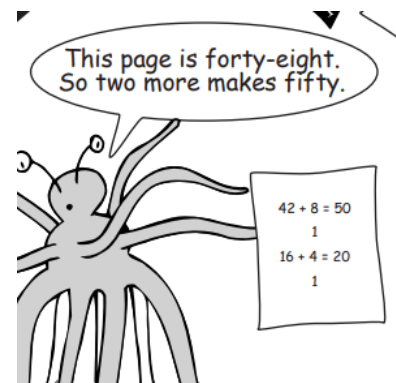
This is an absolutely crucial skill for many forms of mental arithmetic and we need children to be able to do this almost without thinking about it! It is a skill that we need to have on auto-pilot!

1. Use a book with at least 100 pages.
2. Open the book at random.
3. Look at the number on one of the pages.
4. Say this number aloud.
5. How much must be added to this number to make the next multiple of ten?  
E.g. the book page is 38, so 2 must be added to 38 to make 40.
6. Look to see which of you has the number you added, e.g. 2 - that person collects a point.
7. Keep playing like this, turning to different pages in the book until one person has collected a score of 15.

### Challenge

How would you show this as:

- a) Bar model
- b) Number Line
- c) Part Whole
