Indefinite articles

There are two indefinite articles in English: 'a' and 'an'. They are used before a singular noun that has a plural form.

- 'a' is used before consonants b c d f g h
 j k l m n p q r s t v w x y z
 - E.g. <u>a</u> bird or <u>a</u> plane
- 'an' is used before vowel a e i o u
 - E.g. <u>an</u> umbrella or <u>an</u> ant
- Sometimes we use 'an' before the letter H, if we do not pronounce the H.
 - E.g. What <u>an</u> honour to meet you!
