

Curriculum Information Sheet - Autumn Term 1 2019-20

Year 1 Classes: Dancing Dolphins & Talented Turtles

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THEMES	This half term is based around the themes of All About Me and Self- Portraits .
ENGLISH	This term will be dedicated to transition. During the transitional period the following will occur:
writing	 Year 1 continues with a similar structure to what the children are currently used to where the week will involve structured lessons and learning through play Informal observations of your children in their current environment.
	The focus of the key texts this term will be stories from other cultures. The children will be reading and acting out the stories as a class. They will express opinions about main events and characters in a story. The children will also participate in understanding that there is a sequence of events in a story.
	Children this term will also be writing lists and labelling pictures appropriately. They will improve their ability to write sentences using the correct sentence structure and word order (with lots of speaking and listening activities). We will be encouraging children to improve both their print of upper and lower case letters.
	Main key texts: Handa's Surprise, The Sandwich that Max Made
	Guided Reading will begin to take place for children and the focus this term will be to share more information and ideas as a group as well as improving and using their decoding skills to read more fluently. Questions will be asked to ensure children understand what they are reading.

MATHS	Number and Place Value		
	We will be using the White Rose Maths planning scheme to support us to work on ensuring that children can:		
	 Count to ten, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number 		
	 Count, read and write numbers to 10 in numerals and words 		
	 Given a number, identify one more or one less 		
	 Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial 		
	representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.		
	Then, we will move onto working on addition and subtraction with 10, with an emphasis on missing number problems.		
SCIENCE	We will be learning about Animals including Humans this half term, with an emphasis on asking scientific questions, using scientific vocabulary and developing investigative skills.		
	For this terms topic we will be learning how to:		
	 Identify ways of finding out about themselves 		
	 Identify different parts of the body 		
	 Identify their senses and use them to investigate 		
	 Identify and name a variety of common animals 		
	 Be able to describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals including pets).

PHILOSOPHY RELIGION & ETHICS

Focus: Empathy

In this unit, children will learn to identify different feelings, recognizing the nature and physical features of positive and negative feelings (knowing how a feeling feels). Through the use of engaging drama and arts activities and with the use of stories from religious texts, they should be guided into recognizing sensual stimuli and other situations that give rise to different feelings.

PERFORMING ARTS

<u>Music</u>

The children to explore ways of using their voices expressively. They will develop skills of singing while performing actions and create an expressive story. (Unit: Ourselves)

In this unit, the children develop a sense of steady beat through using movement, body percussion and instruments. (Unit: Number)

We will be learning a unit called 'iSafe'. This unit of work introduces the children to the concept of staying safe online. Using the resources available at Thinkuknow, it uses the context of imaginary characters set in imaginary worlds to help children understand the risks associated with sharing personal information online and how to make informed choices.
