

EYFS Half Termly Curriculum Overview Spring 1 Topic: Let's Pretend

Literacy

Phonics

Phonics will continue to be taught every day.

Below are the Phase 2 phonic sounds that we have learnt, please go over these with your child daily.

Phase 2 -

s, a, t, p i, n, m, d g, o, c, k, ck, e, u, r h, b, f, ff, l, ll, ss TW/ HFW- the, to, no, go, I

We will begin to teach Phase 3 sounds;

j, v, w, x, y, z, zz, qu, ch, sh, th, ng, ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, er

Children will learn the trigraphs - ear, air, ure Children will learn the Tricky Words - he, she, we, me, be

Communication and Language

- -We will be discussing a range of stories related to the topic such as Gingerbread Man/ Hansel and Gretel/ Jack and the Beanstalk/ The Three Little Pigs/ Little Red Riding Hood/ Snow White/ Frozen, etc.
- -Children will have the opportunity to ask questions, retell stories and use drama to act out main events.

Reading

Children will;

- -read simple words and match with correct pictures
- -read captions/ simple sentences/ extend sentences that they have read
- -Act out stories
- -retell main events
- -Create alternate endings

Writing

Children will:

- -Segment and blend when writing simple words
- -try to write captions/ simple sentences/ sentences with connectives and adjectives
- -label work and describe
- -Use phase 3 sounds in writing

Understanding the World

In line with our topic, children will be focusing on traditional/fairy tales.

Children will also;

- -explore how plants change (linked with Jack and the Beanstalk)
- -find similarities and differences between people/ characters/ objects
- explore different aspects of books and stories characters, morals, settings
- -link stories in with our values (respect) and the British Values (The Rule of Law)
- -use technology to record and reflect on our work
- explore how different materials are affected by different forces (what happens to the 3 Little Pigs houses when the wolf blows on them, why are the bricks stronger than the straw)

Mathematics

Alongside structured teaching, children will have the opportunity to access a range of maths activities, resources and games independently.

These activities will focus on the following;

Number

- introducing 0
- Continuing to find different ways of making 5
- finding one more and one less of a number
- forming numbers correctly
- using different methods to add and subtract
- beginning to add and subtract by counting forwards and backwards
- comparing groups and amounts to 5
- developing number to 10 (composition, counting, representing)

Shape, space and measure

- developing an understanding of mass and capacity
- exploring 3D shapes
- developing an understanding of height, length and time
- developing understanding of measurements
- describing different positions
- developing spatial awareness
- developing a range of vocabulary around position

Using & Applying

Children will be accessing these objectives through child-initiated activities and adult directed learning.

Philosophy Religion and Ethics education

Focus:

Krishna loves to dress up just like the children do. Children will have the opportunity to learn about the various avatars or incarnations of the Lord.

Personal, Social & Emotional development

Children will be encouraged to;

- -play with a range of children
- -develop confidence to try different and challenging activities
- -think about a range of behaviours and how it makes people feel
- thinking about our feelings and being able to recognise these.
- developing strategies to be able to regulate our emotions and finding ways to calm down.



Expressive Arts and Design

Children explore;

- -creating puppets
- -using role play to act out events
- -dress up as a characters and describe them
- -use different media to create settings
- -describe textures
- -create music with musical instruments

Health and Well-Being

PE - High, Low, Over, Under

The focus of learning will be to explore 'champion gymnastics'. Pupils will create movements and balances in high and low ways on the floor and on apparatus.

Pupils will self-select where to work, exploring movements and balances and start to identify features of another pupil's work

We will also dip into other units such as 'Nursery Rhymes' and as it links to our topics.

Other Physical development will focus on

- -holding a pencil correctly
- -hand and eye coordination
- -forming recognisable letters and numbers
- -using one handed tools and equipment (scissors)
- -throwing/rolling/catching a ball

Health and Self Care

Focus will be on;

- -trying different types of food at school
- -understanding the importance of washing your hands after using the toilet
- -fastening buttons and zipping up their coats
- -exploring healthy lifestyle

Yoga and Meditation

Weekly yoga lessons will focus on flexibility and basic poses through storytelling. Daily meditation takes place in class to prepare for and reflect on learning.

Spanish

Children will focus on numbers up to 5 in Spanish.

- Listening and understanding numbers up to 5 with a song by joining in and responding using actions.
- Getting familiar with number sounds up to 5 in Spanish.
- To count classroom items / toys in Spanish up to 5 in Spanish.
- Recognising numbers up to 5 displayed in Spanish.
- Start to trace numbers up to 5 based on their sound in Spanish.
- Repeating numbers up to 5 in Spanish.
- Imitating sounds of numbers up to 5 and intonation accurately.

Sanskrit

- Topics: My Body: Naming the parts of the body, Numbers 0 - 10: learning to count to 10
- Conversation: Hello: Practising how to say 'Hello' and 'My name is' - learning how to introduce ourselves
- Storytime: The Greatest Treasure and Tucket the Bucket:
 We will be extending our Vocabulary Bank through story time.
- Song: Head Shoulders Knees & Toes: Singing the song using actions.
