Staff/pupils/parents may not know when to isolate	Spread of the virus	The main change is to rules about isolation for contacts: people who are identified as contacts of a positive case are exempt from isolation if they are in one of the following categories. They are however strongly recommended to get a PCR test as soon as possible after being identified as a contact. Categories of people who do not have to isolate despite being contacts of a positive case: fully vaccinated – this means 14 days have passed since the final dose of a COVID-19 vaccine given by the NHS under 18 years, 6 months old taking part or have taken part in a COVID-19 vaccine trial not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons	Yes	No	N/A
Social distancing	Spread of the virus/confusion	The DfE national guidance no longer requires this, however Avanti Meadows will be ready to reintroduce social distancing controls if required by the local situation.	х

We will support members of staff and pupils to wear a mask if they wish to. Face coverings are expected to be worn on public transport both by adults and by pupils. 	x		
Start and end of day	Close contact with people from other households	Staggering the start and end times was an attempt to help parents achieve the social distancing that was a requirement. Staggered start and end times are no longer appropriate; however, Avanti Meadows will continue to remind parents of the ongoing pandemic and the national recommendation to limit close contact with people from other households and that only one parent comes to pick up their child from school.	x		
Reporting cases to the LA and Trust	LA are unaware of positive cases at Avanti Meadows and do not alert Public Health	We need to know about positive cases of Covid at Avanti Meadows so that the borough/Trust can potentially alert Public Health team to emerging issues in the local area. Please do inform the school if your child tests positive. Staff members will inform the school if they test positive.	x		
Tightening restrictions	School is not aware of the contingency plans set by the DFE	The DfE's Contingency Framework sets out thresholds which would trigger involvement from the local Public Health team.	x		
Restricting attendance for staff and pupils who are contacts of positive cases on Health and Safety grounds	Restricting attendance impacts on learning	At current levels of in-school transmission and with the current dominant variant (delta) it is not believed that restricting attendance would be a necessary or proportionate response to the level of risk. Any decision to introduce restrictions on attendance would only be taken with the support of the Director of Public Health. Engagement between schools and the Public Health team would be triggered by the thresholds set out in the DfE Contingency Framework being exceeded.	х

Child could attend school and as a result the virus spreads	The school will remind the pupil/parents that the pupil should isolate pending result of a PCR test. Hygiene	Children and staff do not regularly wash/sanitize hands and as a result the virus spreads	Children will wash/ sanitize their hands on entry to their classroom, before and after play, before and after lunch, before and after PE and before leaving school. Staff will be reminded to do the same. The Site Team will ensure that all classrooms/areas have the necessary equipment in working order to ensure hygiene neasures are in place.			
Disruption to the running of the school in cases of local outbreak	Virus spreads Disruption to learning	 The school has an up-to-date Business Continuity Plan in place – the plan is reviewed as necessary. The school adheres to and keeps up-to-date with the latest local and national advice about school closures – advice is sought from the local HPT or DfE helpline where required. The school will follow Government advice and follow any instructions 	x		
Lack of infection control	Spread of infection	 Spillages of bodily fluids, e.g., respiratory and nasal discharges, are cleaned up immediately in line with guidance, using PPE at all times. Parents are informed not to bring their children to school or on the school premises if they show signs of being unwell and believe they have been exposed to coronavirus. Staff and pupils do not return to school before the minimum recommended exclusion period (or the 'self-isolation' period) has passed, in line with national guidance. Pupils who are unwell are not taken on school trips or permitted to enter public areas used for teaching, e.g., swimming pools. Parents notify the school if their child has an impaired immune system or a medical condition that means they are vulnerable to infections. The school in liaison with individuals' medical professionals where necessary, reviews the needs of pupils who are vulnerable to infections. Any additional provisions for pupils who are vulnerable to infections are put in place by the headteacher, in liaison with the pupil's parents where necessary. 	x		
Classroom management	Infection control	It is no longer required for forward facing tables etc. however care should still be taken on table management in a classroom setting.

III health	Coronavirus Symptoms	 Staff are informed of the symptoms of possible coronavirus infection, e.g., a cough, loss or change to sense of smell or taste and high temperature and are kept up-to-date with national guidance about the signs, symptoms and transmission of coronavirus. Any pupil or member of staff who displays signs of being unwell, such as having a cough, fever or a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste, and believes they have been exposed to coronavirus, is immediately taken out of the class and placed in an area where they will not come into contact with others and are supervised at all times. For pupils the relevant member of staff calls for emergency assistance immediately if pupils' symptoms worsen. The parents of unwell pupils are informed as soon as possible of the situation by a relevant member of staff. Where contact with a pupil's parents cannot be made, appropriate procedures are followed in accordance with those outlined in governmental guidance. Unwell pupils who are waiting to go home are kept in an area where they can be at least two metres away from others. Areas used by unwell staff and pupils who need to go home are appropriately cleaned once vacated, using a disinfectant and care to be taken when cleaning all hard surfaces. If unwell pupils and staff are waiting to go home, they are instructed to use different toilets to the rest of the school to minimise the spread of infection. Any pupils who display signs of infection are taken home immediately, or as soon as practicable, by their parents – the parents are advised to contact NHS 111 immediately or call 999 if the pupil becomes seriously ill or their life is at risk. Any members of staff who display signs of infection are sent home immediately and are advised to contact NHS 111 immediately or call 999 if they become seriously ill or their life is at risk. 	X

Poor management of infectious diseases	Virus may spread	 Staff are instructed to monitor themselves and others and look out for similar symptoms if a pupil or staff member has been sent home with suspected coronavirus. Staff are vigilant and report concerns about their own, a colleague's or a pupil's symptoms to the Head of School or School Business Manager as soon as possible. The school is consistent in its approach to the management of suspected and confirmed cases of coronavirus. The school is informed by pupils' parents when pupils return to school after having coronavirus – the school informs the relevant staff. Staff inform the headteacher when they plan to return to work after having coronavirus. The Site Manager monitors the cleaning standards of school cleaning contractors and discusses any additional measures required with regards to managing the spread of coronavirus. 	X			
Lack of communication	Confusion/ Unsafe Practices	 The school staff reports immediately to the head of school about any cases of suspected coronavirus, even if they are unsure. The head of school contacts the local HPT or follows the advice given from and discusses if any further action needs to be taken. Avanti Meadows will put into place any actions or precautions advised by their local HPT. Avanti Meadows will keep staff and parents adequately updated about any changes to infection control procedures as necessary. 	х			
CEV children	Illness	 All CEV children should attend their education setting unless they are one of the very small number of children under paediatric or other specialist care who have been advised by their GP or clinician not to attend CEV people are no longer advised to shield but may wish to take extra precautions to protect themselves and to follow the practical steps set out in the CEV guidance to minimise their risk of exposure to the virus 	х
