

Cedar Class: Miss Field ' This week in Year Two!

English

In English this week we began our new topic 'Non-Chronological Reports.' Children explored a range of reports and highlighted their features.

(Title, introduction, subheading, paragraph, picture and caption, precise language, facts)

Science

In Science children investigated different materials to find out which could be squashed, stretched, bent and twisted!

Maths

We began our topic 'Multiplication and Division' this week which will see us through to half term! Children explored multiplication by

making equal groups.



There are <u>5</u> equal groups with <u>4</u> in each group. <u>4</u> + <u>4</u> + <u>4</u> + <u>4</u> = 20 <u>5</u> × <u>4</u> = 20

Art

Children used the printing block they made last week to create a beautiful piece of artwork! They produced a vibrant and repetitive pattern using a range of different coloured paints!

Phonics home learning



Thank you to all those who attended the Early reading and Phonics parent meetings last term. If you were not able to attend, please do spend some time reading through the presentation sent out before the half term.

As mentioned during this session, children will be bringing home <u>2</u> <u>different reading books</u> each Friday afternoon. One of them (story book) will be a book the child has read each day in class and feels confident and able to read. The other (a 'book bag' book) will be a similar story that is new to the child. They will also be bringing home their reading record. We ask that you sign and date these reading records each time you read with your child –Leaving a comment to tell us how they did will also be very helpful.

In order for us to teach our lessons, **both of these books** <u>must</u> **be back in school each week on a Wednesday**. We ask for your support in ensuring your child is returning these books, in the condition they came home in, to school.
